Re-Start a Heart Day - Monday 16 October

Year 10 are taking part in the National "Re-start a Heart Day" where they will do CPR for a 30-minute session. The sessions will be short and sharp but hopefully it means that an entire year group will have taken part in some basic but vital lifesaving skills. Below is some information provided by Yorkshire Ambulance Service explaining why this can be so important:

1. A cardiac arrest patient's chance of survival dramatically increases if #CPR can begin before the ambulance service arrives on scene.



2. Less than one in 10 people in the UK survive a cardiac arrest but thousands more lives could be saved if witnesses start CPR immediately.











3. Chances of survival drop 10% a minute if CPR is not started when someone has had a cardiac arrest.
