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Dear Parent/Carer

Please accept my apologies for any inconvenience the school closure may have caused you today. We were really hoping to be open, even if it was with a delayed start. However, we had to take the decision to close on the grounds of health and safety. Given the amount of snow on site, it would not have been possible for the site to be cleared and safe for staff and students. In addition, many of our staff would have struggled to get to school, therefore I would not have had adequate staffing levels.

I do hope your young person gets involved in our creative challenge as well as their usual lessons on Showbie. We look forward to seeing lots of snow-based creativity!

Strike Days on Wednesday 15 and Thursday 16 March

At the time of writing, the planned teachers' strikes for next week are still going ahead. Based on the number of colleagues who have been on strike in the past, we will not be able to open the school to all students. Therefore, school will be closed to Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 students. As on the previous strike days, we are open to those students who have requested a place in our priority provision.

Arrangements for Year 12 & Year 13 students

School will be open for the full day therefore students should arrive at the normal time and go straight to registration.

If the teacher is not striking then students will be taught their lessons that day. If the teacher is not available then they will be supported to study independently in the sixth form area, as a supervised study session. Students should bring work with them to ensure that they can use the time as productively to support their learning.

Arrangements for Year 11 students

We need to reduce the length of the school day, so the students will be in school from 8.25am until 1.15pm.

All Year 11 students should arrive as usual and go straight to their form room for tutor period. They will then go to lessons 1-4 as normal, if their teacher is in school. If their class teacher is on strike then the students will be engaged in supervised independent study in key allocated areas of the school. Students should arrive prepared to spend some time during the day focussed on retrieval practice and preparing for the exams. If they have a timetabled PE lesson this will go ahead as usual, so please ensure they bring their PE kits.

Students who study Food Technology will be completing their controlled assessment that day and they will need to be in school for the full day. Mrs Ellis will contact you with further details regarding what is required.

We will also be taking the opportunity for students to complete any mock exams they may have missed last week due to illness.
