Durham University Supported Progression 2025

Supported Progression is a programme for Year 12 students living in the North- East of England. They'll experience what it's like to be an undergraduate student here at Durham on a five-day summer school and will receive online information throughout Years 12 and 13. Want to find out more? Attend one of our online information events in February to learn about the programme, entry criteria, and application process

Our Supported Progression summer school runs from Monday 28 July 2025 to Friday 1 August 2025. Students will also attend online events in the run-up to the summer school.

During the summer school, they'll experience student life by staying in one of our 17 colleges, taking part in academic taster sessions, exploring various extra-curricular activities and meeting current Durham students. If they successfully finish the programme, they'll receive a guaranteed alternative offer from Durham if they apply in Year 13.Applications are open until **Thursday 20 March 2025 at 11:59pm (GMT).**

Dental Summer Schools 2025

The Dental Schools Council, with funding from NHS England, are offering Year 11 and Year 12 students the opportunity to attend a summer school to understand what it is like to study dentistry.

The summer schools are aimed at students from under-represented backgrounds who attend a state school or college. **Eligibility criteria:**

- Eligibility criteria for the summer schools includes that the student is:
- From a widening participation background and
- Academically:
- Has an interest in STEM subjects and are, or are considering, studying science in their post-16 studies and medicine post-18
- Has predicted A-level grades ABB (or equivalent) and
- Has predicted GCSE grades B or above in English and Mathematics (or equivalent)

What will students experience at a summer school? Students will:

- Get an understanding of what it is like to study dentistry, including the different teaching methods that are used. This aims to help them consider which dental school they might want to apply to.
- Get an understanding of what the values and behaviours of dental students and dentists are.
- Get an overview of the range of dental careers available. This includes:
- Other healthcare options
- Healthcare options that are non-patient focused
- Specialities where there are shortages.
- Engage in activities designed to build their confidence and network with others. This includes meeting academics and university students.
- Have opportunities to discuss their options and seek advice, including:
- Receiving support regarding applications and admissions such as advice on preparing for interviews and admissions tests.
- Take part in social activities so they can build their own community and network.
