Any students applying to the University of Leeds, with a household income level of less than 42,875 GBP, may be **eligible to apply** for a means-tested undergraduate scholarship (worth up to 3,000 GBP a year).

The scholarships are non-repayable and in addition to the financial support they can receive from the [government](#) (ie tuition fee loan or maintenance loan). The scholarships are available thanks to the generous support from alumni and other organisations. To apply students must submit a fully completed. Applications will open in March. NHS Insights Placement Scheme.

The NHS Finance Insights placement scheme offers paid work experience in NHS organisations throughout England to individuals aged 18 and above, who do not plan to attend university and come from lower socio-economic backgrounds. The scheme aims to attract diverse talent from local communities served by the NHS into the finance sector. It provides a 12-month experience in an entry-level (band 2) finance role, allowing candidates to develop new skills and gain on-the-job work experience. Upon completion of the placement, each candidate should feel well-prepared to apply for NHS opportunities, including apprenticeships or other entry-level roles, and be confident in transitioning to professional working environments.

Why apply for the NHS Insights Placement Scheme?

- Paid Work Experience: Gain hands-on experience in an entry-level finance role within the NHS.
- Skill Development: Develop new skills and gain valuable on-the-job experience.
- Diverse Exposure: Rotate through different finance departments and work with a wide range of talented professionals.
- Professional Growth: Receive training and development throughout the placement, preparing you for future NHS roles or apprenticeships.
- Flexible Working Patterns and Enjoy the Benefits of working for the NHS: You will be entitled to 27 days of annual leave, have all bank holidays off from work, and can access to a wide range of discounts via the Blue Light Card

Eligibility Criteria

The initiative aims to support young people aged 18+ from low-income families, and applicants interested must meet the following criteria:

- Aged 18 and above.
- From a low-income family.
- Attending or recently attended a state school or college.
- Not planning to attend university.
- Eligible for free school meals at any point in the past six years or from a lower socio-economic background.
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This scheme is a unique chance for students to kick start their careers in the finance sector while contributing to the vital work of the NHS. We encourage eligible students to apply and take advantage of this incredible opportunity.
