UCAS - responding to offers

Students who missed the session from the University of Bradford can get advice from the UCAS website or speak to Ms Ullah if you are concerned about the process. The main points to note are:

It is highly advisable to wait for ALL your offers before taking any action so you can consider your response carefully.

- You are required to make one FIRM choice this will be your most favoured university with achievable entry requirements
- you must then make your INSURANCE choice be careful to make sure that this has a lower entry requirement to your first choice and that you are prepared to go there. NB On results day, if you don't meet the entry requirements for your first choice, the insurance choice will become your firm offer and you will be expected to take this up.
 - Finally, you will need to decline any other offers.

Reply dates - These are based on when we get the last decision in from your unis or colleges. Check your application to see your personal deadline.

- If you receive your last decision on or before 14 May 2025, your reply date is 5 June 2025 (except
- if you're using Extra to find a place).
- If you receive your last decision on or before 17 July 2025, your reply date is 23 July 2024 (including Extra choices).

Year 13 For those who have applied for deferred entry already ONLY 2026 entry applications - These dates are slightly different

- If you receive your last decision on or before 31 March 2026, your reply date is 6 May 2026 (except if you're using Extra to find a place).
- If you receive your last decision on or before 13 May 2026, your reply date is 3 June 2026 (except if you're using Extra to find a place).
- If you receive your last decision on or before 15 July 2026, your reply date is 22 July 2026 (including Extra choices).

University of Leeds Means - Tested Scholarships 2025

Any students applying to the University of Leeds, with a household income level of less than 42,875 GBP, may be **eligible to apply** for a means-tested undergraduate scholarship (worth up to 3,000 GBP a year).

The scholarships are non-repayable and in addition to the financial support they can receive from the government (ie tuition fee loan or maintenance loan). The scholarships are available thanks to the generous support from alumni and other organisations. To apply students must submit a fully completed application form by I 2pm on Monday 2 June 2025. Summer School Launch - Year 12 Residentials Summer School - Selwyn College

Each of our summer schools is a two-night residential course, with all food and accommodation included free of cost to participants. Travel bursaries will also be available. You are able to choose from the following three subject streams:

Physical Natural Sciences (Monday 30 June – Wednesday 2 July)

Most Cambridge first-year Natural Sciences (Physical) students are taking the physics and/or chemistry options — they know more-or-less what to expect at university because they attained qualifications in those sciences in the last few years of school. A 'true' natural scientist may be more interested in, or might at least wish to gain proficiency in, other areas like materials science and earth sciences. How can you get hands-on experience in other branches of the physical sciences when there's no school qualification? Come and attend this summer school: there'll be demonstration lectures in these areas of science, as well as in the mathematics that underpins the natural sciences, and plenty of opportunity to find out about university-level physics and chemistry as well

Languages and Cultures (Wednesday 2 July – Friday 4 July)

Please note that you do **not** need to be taking an A-level language in order to apply for this course.

Are you interested in film, literature, history, or language? Would you like to explore these themes across different contexts and gain insights into other cultures along the way? If so, then please apply to join us at our Languages and Cultures summer school. There are a number of different options at Cambridge for studying one or more modern languages while pursuing interests in different aspects of the humanities: we offer degrees in Modern and Medieval Languages, History and Modern Languages, Asian and Middle Eastern Studies, and Linguistics to name a few. For some of these pathways, no prior experience of formal language study is required. The aim of this residential is to give you the chance, whether you have studied languages before or not, to explore these different options through a series of taster sessions delivered by academic experts. You'll have the chance to read texts, watch films, solve linguistic puzzles, find out about unfamiliar historical periods, and think about the politics and mechanics of translation. Fluency in foreign languages and an understanding of foreign cultures, as well as analytical and research skills, are all in great demand on the job market, so why not come and see what doors might open for you?

Unearthing the Past (Tuesday 8 July - Thursday 10 July)

Do you love both history and science? Are you curious about how people lived thousands of years ago? Do you want to learn how we can piece together clues from the past? This summer school might be just the thing for you. Run in association with Newnham College and colleagues from the Department of Archaeology and the Cambridge Archaeological Unit, this summer school at Selwyn will introduce you to the possibilities that an Archaeology degree can open up for your university studies and future career. If you're interested in human evolution and biology, ancient cultures and languages, or how heritage affects identity and politics today, you'll find something of interest. There'll be the chance to get hands-on with artefacts as well as listening to lectures, visiting an archaeological unit, and exploring museums. You'll meet lecturers in Archaeology and Biological Anthropology and will hear from the Director of the Cambridge Archaeological Unit, who is himself a graduate of Selwyn. Whether or not you've thought about an Archaeology degree before and whichever A-level subjects you're taking, if you'd like to explore themes and methods at the intersection of history and science and to gain some valuable new experiences then please do apply to join us.
