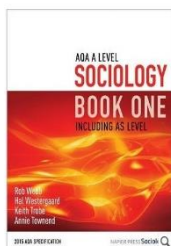

Introduction to Sociology




Sociology is the study of society and of people and their behaviour. Sociologists study a wide range of topics such as those within our specifications and create theories, which are explanations of the patterns we find in society to explain human behaviour and the workings of society.

As an introduction to the subject, explore some key concepts, apply them to some of the key theories you will be studying and think about what sociology can tell us about society today.
