Entry Requirements

To study Chemistry at A level you will need grades at least 5, 6 in two GCSE sciences. You also will need at least grade 5 in GCSE maths.



Knowledge & Skills gained:

- An understanding of how the chemical elements interact and the role they play in making up our world and beyond.
- An appreciation of How Science Works
- The relevance of science beyond the laboratory analytical, evaluative and synoptic skills.
- Practical skills, including the ability to plan and manipulate information and data.

Complementary Subjects

There are no requirements to study Chemistry alongside other specific subjects, but many of our students also take other science A-levels and Maths A-level.

Future Opportunities

University - Students studying Chemistry often go on to study Medicine, Nursing, Dentistry, Veterinary Science, Chemistry or natural sciences.

Employment opportunities – Chemistry is a well-respected subject due to the breadth of skills developed. As a result many specialist fields will employ and train students with A level Chemistry such as the pharmaceutical and petrochemical sectors. In addition, other sectors such as finance and business recruit students of chemistry.
