Entry Requirements

To study Drama and Theatre Studies at A level you will need grade 4 or above in GCSE drama or a successful audition piece if GCSE Drama was not studied. An interest in the performing arts and a commitment to learning is vital. It is important that you are interested in gaining a greater understanding of how plays work and that you are keen to be involved in performances

- Independence of mind in relation to developing your own ideas.
- Development of a broad range of theatre skills.
- An wealth of understanding of key theatre practitioners, playwrights, theatre movements and performance styles
- Acting skills, confidence, time management and team skills
