



The mathematicians - who have been ably supported by a trio of year 9 students have been taking part in Maths Circles, a program designed to stretch and challenge their mathematical thinking. The initiative is funded by Axiom, a charity committed to promoting excellence in Maths, with the aim of following the students all the way through their time at Lawnswood to year 11.





In November, we opened up our classrocms to Year 7 parents to gain firsthand experience of our maths lessons. The Family Maths sessions ran for four



weeks and covered fractions, algebra and negative numbers. If you missed out, be sure to look out for it again next year!

That being said, their more impressive performances have been in the cup ties, where they recorded a whopping 7-0 win over Dixons Unity to see them through to rd2, where they edged out Horsforth in a tight penalty shootout. The boys will look to advance through to the quarter finals with a win against Priesthorpe in January

Y11 Boys Football- some very tight draws and losses this year and an unlucky cup run have clearly spurred the team on as they recorded their first win of the season last month, cruising past ralph throsby in a 3-0 victory. The lads will hope this is the kickstart of momentum they need to have a successful rest of the season.

Y9 Boys Football

The boys Y9 Football team has found their form early this season, with five games played, resulting in two convincing wins and three draws this season against some proven opponents. A narrow 1-0 loss in the cup saw them exit in round 2, but a better run of form now than this time last year shows the whole-team improvement made over summer.

Girls Football- KS4

The girls Y10 team had their first outing of the season last week, showing promising signs of good results to come. Having had time to gel as a team, the PE Department sees the promise within the squad, with the girls having very competitive and tight scores against the likes of Guiseley and Benton Park

Girls Football- KS3

The ks3 girls football team have been one of our most active teams this year down in PE, playing over ten games already this year and recording a very healthy 50% win rate. This is something the PE Dept are extremely proud of considering last year we did not have a ks3 girls squad. The highlight of the year so far came in the form of a 3-0 away win against LWA, a team who weeks prior beat us 7-3 at home.

KS3 BOYS- The y7&8 boys Rugby team have found great success already this season, beating Abbey Grange and Priesthorpe in their opening fixtures and narrowly missing out on qualifying for the regional finals of the Rhino's 9's tournament. The boys will look to improve their winning record in the new year, with several tournaments and merit league fixtures set to be played.

KS3 GIRLS- Our ks3 girls team have played five games this year, all coming in the Leeds Rhino's 9's tournament and with a record of 1W 2D 2L. The draws were made from excellent comebacks, with the girls being down two tries each time and coming back in the latter stages of the game to claim two very late equalisers. The girls have an indoor 'touch rugby' tournament hosted here at Lawnswood school to look forward to in January 2026.

Rowing. Our ks3 mixed team had a good run in the leeds rhinos rowing competition held at headingley stadium, with standout performances from our y7 team who either won their events or secured medal positions. They also came 4th in the relay, narrowly missing out on a medal.

Indoor athletics- hosted at Lawnswood, our y7&8 teams put in very commendable performances in their first ever indoor athletics tournaments. Lawnswood recorded dominant wins in both the boys and girls field events across both year groups, coming first in 17 out of the 22 field events on offer. After getting to grips with the rebound boards, our track events picked up well, recording top 3 finishes in over 60% of the running events. Most notably recording wins in the 2 and 3 lap individual races.


